Introduction to Program Objectives

3 to 6 Years old

The Sounds of Water

- Explain and demonstrate that there are many different ways to produce sound
- Teach children that, depending on the volume of an item and the material with which you combine it, you will make some type of sound.
- Introduce children to the concept of sound waves.
- Introduce children to some English vocabulary words associated with sound.



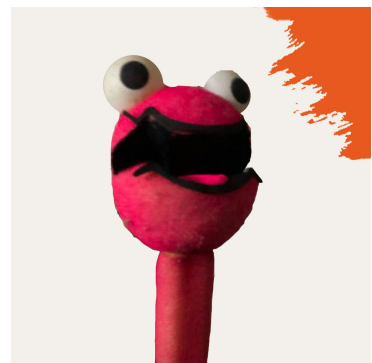
Loud and soft



- Develop attention and listening skills through the story telling.
- Work on body expression and being uninhibited.
- Learn the difference between a loud sound and a soft sound.
- Develop gross and rhythmic motor skills.
- Introduce children to the English vocabulary words associated with loud and soft sounds.

Qualities of sound: The tone

- Capture the children's attention through storytelling and develop listening skills.
- Enhance and strengthen the differentiation of the tone of the different animals.
- Learn to recognize different tones.
- Develop the abilities of singing and tuning one's voice.
- Introduce the children to English vocabulary words associated with tone.



Introduction to Program Objectives

7 to 11 Years old

Percussion Family

- Understand how a drum makes sound.
- Increase attention and listening abilities.
- Build and play a recycled drum.
- Introduce the rest of the percussion family and the sounds they make: plates and other small percussion instruments.
- Introduce children to some English vocabulary words associated to music.



Rhythmic Reading



- Work on body expression and controlled physical movement.
- Get to know a metronome and learn its function.
- Learn the musical notes in a fun and dynamic way.
- Learn a rhythmic choreography and develop rhythmic coordination.
- Introduce children to some English vocabulary words associated to rhythm.

The Musicogram Enigma

- Identify the different instruments of a song and match these instruments with their image.
- Learn and understand what a *musicogram* is.
- Listen to classical music by Tchaikovsky and identify the instruments and the parts in which they appear.
- Introduce the students to English vocabulary related to music.

Dancing with Spikey- 3 to 6 Years old

Kate loves to exercise, and she is really good at it. So, when **Spikey** and his friend **Izzy Wizzy** ask for help preparing dance moves for the end of year dance, she quickly offers to help.
